

Exploration of the Expression of Color Emotion in Oil Painting Sketch Creation

The stronger the hue contrast, the stronger the visual impact of the work, such as red and green, yellow and blue, black and white, etc., and express strong emotional conflicts by strengthening the visual impact. Brightness contrast can strengthen the three-dimensional sense and spatial sense of objects, and the contrast between dark and bright parts makes the picture expression more vivid and rich. Purity contrast can further highlight bright colors or make dim colors more introverted, which helps to create a richer emotional level. In addition, color echo is also indispensable, otherwise it will make the picture split seriously. Artists let the colors in the picture echo each other and improve the overall sense of the picture.

For example, if there is a touch of red in a corner of the picture, it can appear again in other parts, making the whole picture more coherent and rhythmic. Scientific color composition and layout will help artists guide people to the emotional world they have created, so that the audience can experience emotional resonance and spiritual touch ^[9].

5. Matters needing attention in color emotional expression in oil painting sketch creation

Low-purity colors are elegant, soft, and restrained.

5.2. Integrating with the sketch scene

We should pay attention to the observation of natural light, and the colors of different light will also change. For example, the sunshine in the morning and evening gives the object a warm hue; cloudy days will make colors darker. We should grasp the color accurately according to the actual light, so as to express our emotions better. At the same time, we should also consider the environmental atmosphere. For example, quiet villages use soft colors to express pastoral tranquility; the bustling city uses bright colors to express liveliness and vitality ^[10].

5.3. Adding personal emotions

Artists should keep sincere expression, effectively integrate their emotions into colors, and avoid imitating and pursuing popular color styles. Only sincere emotional expression can move people's hearts. At the same time, we should also pay attention to the moderation of emotional expression. The emotional expression of color should not be exaggerated. On the premise of conforming to the overall atmosphere of the picture, color should be used appropriately to convey emotion, so as not to make the picture appear too impetuous or chaotic.
