Research on the Revitalization and Utilization of the Cultural Heritage of "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" in Liwan District, Guangzhou, and the Coordinated Development of the Urban Art District

Abstract: This article takes the "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" festival in Liwan District, Guangzhou as a case study to explore the model of revitalizing cultural heritage and the synergistic development of urban art districts. Through field research and observations of cultural and artistic activities, the study analyzes the methods of cultural inheritance for this traditional festival and its transformation within the modern urban environment. The study indicates that "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" not only continues the important cultural traditions of the Lingnan region but also, through its integration with urban art districts, promotes the development of the cultural and creative industries and enhances the community's cultural identity. This paper offers new ideas and practical references for the revitalization of urban cultural heritage and the collaborative development of art districts.

1. Introduction

1.1. Research Background

Cultural heritage is not only a testament to the past but also a crucial resource for modern society and future development. In the context of globalization, cultural heritage faces multiple challenges, including demolition and reconstruction in the process of modernization, the gradual decline of traditional culture, and a disconnect from contemporary cultural needs. How to preserve and revitalize cultural heritage in modern society has become

a global issue.

With the advancement of urbanization, many local governments and cultural management departments have begun to recognize the close connection between cultural heritage and urban development. Rational utilization of cultural heritage can enhance local characteristics and promote social, economic, and cultural development in cities. Liwan District of Guangzhou City, as a representative region of Lingnan culture, possesses a unique historical and cultural background that provides rich resources for cultural heritage protection.

Liwan District boasts not only tangible cultural heritage such as historic buildings like Renwei Ancestral Temple, but also intangible cultural heritage, including traditional folk festivals like the "Beidi's Birthday on March 3." However, with rapid urban expansion, traditional folk culture festivals are facing challenges in adapting to modernization. To ensure the inheritance and innovation of cultural heritage, the Liwan District government and cultural institutions have taken various measures in recent years to actively promote the revitalization and utilization of cultural heritage.

1.2. Research purpose and significance

1.2.1. Research purpose

The main purpose of this study is to explore how to revitalize and utilize traditional culture in modern urban development through an in-depth analysis of the cultural heritage of the "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" in Liwan District and to integrate it with the development of art districts. Specifically, this study aims to answer the following questions:

- (1) How can cultural heritage be integrated with contemporary culture and creative industries through revitalization and utilization?
- (2) How can traditional cultural festivals synergize with the development of urban art districts?
- (3) How can the sustainable development of urban culture be promoted through the coordinated development of cultural heritage and art districts?

1.2.2. Research significance

The significance of this study is reflected in the following aspects:

- (1) Theoretical significance: This study provides a new theoretical framework for cultural heritage protection, urban art district construction, and creative industry development, aiming to deepen the understanding of cultural heritage revitalization and utilization and promote academic research in this field
- (2) Practical significance: The practical exploration of Liwan District has strong reference value for other cities. The revitalization path and development model provided by this study can offer specific guidance suggestions for cultural heritage protection, revitalization, and art district development in other regions.
- (3) Social significance: This study emphasizes the role of traditional folk culture festivals in enhancing social cohesion and cultural identity, helping to raise public awareness of cultural heritage protection. Simultaneously, the combination of culture and creative industries can also promote social and economic development, improving the quality of life for local residents.

1.3. Research questions and methods

1.3.1. Research questions

- (1) What are the challenges faced in the process of cultural heritage revitalization? How can these challenges be overcome through coordinated development with art districts?
- (2) How can the interaction mechanism between art districts and cultural heritage be realized? Which successful cooperation models can provide references for other cities?

1.3.2. Research methods

This study employs various research methods, including literature analysis, case studies, field research, and interviews.

- (1) Literature analysis: By reviewing relevant literature, this study systematically organizes theoretical research achievements on cultural heritage revitalization and utilization, urban art district development, and cultural and creative industries, providing theoretical support for the analytical framework.
- (2) Case studies: This study selects typical cases of cultural festivals and urban art district development, such as "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" in Liwan District. Through detailed analysis of these specific activities and projects, effective paths and models for cultural heritage revitalization and utilization are explored.
- (3) Field research: This study conducts a field investigation of the "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" activity in Liwan District, observing the specific implementation of traditional cultural festivals and deeply understanding their interaction with local residents and art districts through participation.
- (4) Interviews: Random interviews are conducted with cultural heritage protection departments, art district managers, and community residents participating in the "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" activity in Liwan District to understand their views and suggestions on cultural heritage revitalization and coordinate development with art districts.

2. Overview of the cultural heritage of "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" in Liwan district

2.1. Historical origins of "Beidi's Birthday on March 3"

"Beidi's Birthday on March 3" is an important cultural festival in the Lingnan region, especially in the Liwan District of Guangzhou. Its origin can be traced back to the worship of Beidi in the Taoist belief system. Beidi is also known as Xuantian Shangdi. In the Lingnan region, due to its geographical proximity to the ocean and frequent floods, ancient people worshipped Beidi to pray for good weather and social peace.

The rise of Beidi worship in the Lingnan region is closely related to polytheistic worship and the development of Taoism in ancient China. Since the Han Dynasty, Taoism has gradually spread in the southern regions, and Beidi, as a part of Taoist culture, has become one of the important objects of worship for local residents. Especially for fishermen, merchants, and residents in the area around Liwan District, who relied on water transportation and agricultural development, they prayed for Beidi's protection and hoped to avoid natural disasters. Based on this, every year on the third day of the third lunar month, people would hold folk activities to celebrate Beidi's birthday and express their respect and wishes to Beidi through grand celebrations and folk activities.

Over time, Beidi's birthday has not only been a manifestation of worship but also an important festive activity integrated into local social, cultural, and economic life. Especially in Guangzhou's Liwan District, Beidi's birthday activities not only cover traditional folk art but also give rise to rich community activities and cultural exhibitions, becoming a platform to showcase the multicultural integration of Lingnan.

2.2. Folk activities and cultural connotations of Beidi's birthday

"Beidi's Birthday on March 3" not only reflects Beidi's folk customs but also carries rich folk culture and unique social values in the Lingnan region. Every year during Beidi's birthday, people in Liwan District hold diverse folk activities, constantly adding new elements and events, which not only reflect the local cultural inheritance but also provide opportunities for foreign tourists to deeply understand Lingnan culture.

2.2.1. Traditional folk art

The core of Beidi's birthday activities is rooted in local folk performances, dance, music, and other ways to express awe and prayer. It covers a wide range of folk activities such as prayer, parades, and cultural performances, aiming to pray for Beidi's protection and a smooth year. In recent years, these folk activities have strictly followed traditional forms, preserving the essence of traditional customs while injecting the vitality of modern culture. In particular, Beidi's birthday celebrations have become an important cultural event celebrated by Guangzhou citizens and tourists.

2.2.2. Temple festival and folk performances

As the most traditional cultural temple festival in the center of Guangzhou, Beidi's birthday is mainly held in Renwei Ancestral Temple and its surrounding areas in Liwan District. The atmosphere during the temple festival is lively and bustling, with rich and colorful folk performances, including traditional prayers, dragon and lion dances, parade performances, and more. These performances not only showcase the traditional folk art of the Lingnan region but also attract a large number of tourists and traditional folk culture lovers from home and abroad to visit and experience.

2.2.3. Community interaction and cultural inheritance

Beidi's birthday activities not only reflect the manifestations of folk art but also become an important occasion for community members to interact. During the festival, local residents actively participate in various cultural activities, such as long table dinners, cultural and artistic activities, and cross-regional folk culture integration exhibitions in 2024, which enhance community cohesion. At the same time, many traditional cultural skills are also inherited and promoted through this festive activity. The elder generation explains and demonstrates Lingnan culture to the younger generation, strengthening cultural identity and belonging.

2.3. Cultural status of Renwei ancestral temple

Renwei Ancestral Temple, located in the Liwan District of Guangzhou, is the main venue for folk art activities related to Beidi worship. The temple has a long history and elegant architectural style, preserving the essence of Lingnan architecture from the Ming and Qing dynasties. The Beidi (Xuantian Shangdi) worshipped in the temple is the spiritual sustenance of local believers. Every year during Beidi's birthday, Renwei Ancestral Temple becomes the center of celebration activities.

Renwei Ancestral Temple not only has significant importance in the expression of folk art but also carries rich historical and cultural connotations. The architectural decorations, stone carvings, and wall paintings in the temple embody the essence of Taoist culture and Lingman art, providing important materials for studying Lingman folk art culture and folk worship. During Beidi's birthday every year, prayer customs are also held in the temple, adding a strong cultural atmosphere to the festive activities.

2.4. Overview of the 14th "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" activities

2.4.1. Combination of tradition and innovation in activity arrangements

The 14th "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" activities were successfully held in April 2024. This event not only carried traditional folk art but also incorporated many innovative elements, reflecting the balance between cultural inheritance and modern development in Liwan District.

During the temple festival, various activities such as prayer events, dragon and lion dances, Cantonese opera and music culture, Xiguan lady clothing displays, Pan Tang Wu Xiu (five excellent products of Pan Tang), Han and Tang dynasty ancient charm, Wu Yang Wu Xian (five sheep and five immortals), floating colors, Eight Immortals Crossing the Sea, Lingnan martial arts, unicorn dances, and puppet shows were held as scheduled, enriching the festive atmosphere of Beidi's birthday. To attract more young people and tourists from home and abroad, the entire folk activity also incorporated some modern cultural elements, such as Shangsi outings, large-scale folk culture parades, Hanfu lantern night markets, and online promotion through digital technology. Beidi's birthday has expanded beyond traditional celebration forms into a broader online cultural exhibition, giving the festive activities a sense of the times and participation.

2.4.2. Community participation and volunteer service

The 14th Beidi Birthday emphasized wide community participation. Pan Tang villagers set up a standard banquet at Liang Family Ancestral Hall, inviting villagers and friendly villages to gather and celebrate Beidi's birthday together. Many residents and organizations in Liwan District also actively participated in the planning and implementation of folk activities. Volunteer service stations were established to provide tourists with guidance, information inquiry, and other services, further improving the organization and service quality of the festive activities. The active participation of community members not only contributed to the successful hosting of the festival but also strengthened community cohesion and cultural identity.

2.4.3. Cultural exchange and promotion

This year's Beidi Birthday also attracted cultural delegations from other regions, such as Guizhou folk culture parade teams, promoting exchanges and cooperation between Lingnan culture and the outside world. Through festive activities, Liwan District not only showcased its rich historical and cultural heritage but also enhanced the influence of Lingnan culture. During these activities, people from different cultural backgrounds shared and experienced the unique charm of Lingnan culture, thus expanding the popularity and cultural value of Beidi's birthday and aiming to promote cultural exchanges in the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area.

2.4.4. Activity effectiveness and significance

The 14th "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" not only inherited traditional Lingnan culture but also further expanded the influence of folk culture festivals through innovative activity formats. During the event, Liwan District

welcomed a large number of tourists and lovers of traditional intangible cultural heritage and folk culture, which not only enhanced the local popularity but also promoted the development of the local tourism economy. More importantly, while inheriting and developing traditional culture, Beidi's birthday has become an important component of Liwan District's cultural and creative industries, playing a role in promoting the two-way development of community culture and economy.

3. The revitalization and utilization of intangible cultural heritage

3.1. Theory and practice of intangible cultural heritage revitalization

3.1.1. Concept of intangible cultural heritage revitalization

Additionally, Italy's Renaissance cultural heritage revitalization project has resonated traditional culture with contemporary art through integration with modern art and design, drawing more young people's attention.

These successful cases demonstrate that cultural heritage revitalization should be tailored to local unique cultural characteristics and innovative ideas and approaches. By doing so, cultural heritage can adapt to modern society, achieving the sustainable development of historical culture and socio-economic progress.

3.2. Revitalization path of the "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" cultural heritage in Liwan district

As a traditional cultural heritage of Liwan District, "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" occupies an important position in local social life. Through cultural heritage revitalization, the Beidi Birthday celebration has not only been innovated in form but also comprehensively developed in terms of culture, economy, and society. The following

are the main approaches taken by Liwan District in revitalizing the "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" cultural heritage.

3.2.1. Promotion and development

Firstly, by developing cultural tourism, Liwan District can promote "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" as a cultural landmark to the market. During the festival, tourists from inside and outside Liwan District can experience the unique charm of Lingnan culture through participation in folk art performances, temple fairs, cultural shows, and other activities. The local government should continuously promote the development of cultural tourism projects, integrating natural landscapes and historical architectural resources in Lychee Bay to form a deep fusion of culture and tourism, effectively enhancing the economic value of cultural heritage. Secondly, communities are essential agents in the revitalization of intangible cultural heritage. In the revitalization process of Beidi's birth, Liwan District should encourage community residents to actively participate in the planning and implementation of the festival, maintaining the authenticity of traditional culture and strengthening community cohesion. Inviting more folk art groups and cultural inheritors to showcase Lingnan's traditional skills such as dragon and lion dances, Cantonese opera performances, etc., through the Beidi Birthday platform can also complement the revitalization and inheritance of cultural heritage.

3.2.2. Application of modern technology

Liwan District fully utilizes modern technological means in revitalizing the "Beidi's Birthday on March 3" cultural heritage. For instance, traditional festival activities are displayed and promoted online through digital platforms such as social media, breaking geographical restrictions and attracting more young people's attention. Simultaneously, with the help of intelligent navigation systems and digital exhibition technology, tourists can comprehend the historical origins and cultural connotations of Beidi's birth more comprehensively, enhancing the interactivity and engagement of cultural experiences.

These challenges mainly focus on the authenticity protection of cultural heritage, sustainability of community participation, and balancing cultural and commercial interests.

3.3.3. Balancing cultural and commercial interests

The revitalization of cultural heritage inevitably involves the drive of commercial interests. 3.4. Countermeasures and suggestions

3.4.1. Strengthening the development and implementation of cultural heritage protection laws and regulations

The government should enhance the formulation and implementation of laws and regulations related to cultural heritage protection, ensuring that the authenticity and integrity of cultural connotations are not compromised during the revitalization process. By establishing special funds for cultural heritage protection and formulating detailed protection plans, effective protection of cultural heritage can be achieved during its development and utilization.

3.4.2. Deepening cultural education and promotion

Through school education and community training, the education and promotion of traditional culture should be strengthened, enhancing the younger generation's cognition and identification of traditional culture. Encouraging cooperation between schools and cultural institutions to develop cultural heritage-themed courses and activities allows students to deepen their understanding and interest in Beidi culture through personal experience and

interaction.

3.4.3. Establishing a government-enterprise cooperation mechanism

While promoting the development of the cultural industry, the government should establish a close cooperation mechanism with enterprises. In the development of cultural and creative products, it is essential to ensure that commercial exploitation does not deviate from the main theme of cultural inheritance. By formulating reasonable standards and norms for commercial development, the core values of cultural heritage can be effectively maintained in the process of commercialization.

3.4.4. Increasing regional cooperation and international exchange efforts

Liwan District should actively establish cooperative relationships with surrounding regions and international cultural institutions. Through cross-regional cultural cooperation projects, the dissemination scope of Beidi culture can be expanded, enhancing its cultural influence. Inviting international cultural delegations and artists to participate in Beidi activities can not only enrich the content but also promote diversified cultural exchanges and integration.

4. Urban art districts

4.1. Overview of Liwan district's urban art districts

Liwan district, as a historic and cultural area of Guangzhou, boasts a rich cultural heritage and profound humanistic history. Driven by modernization, Liwan has gradually formed multiple urban art districts. These districts not only showcase the unique charm of local culture and art but have also become new sources of regional economic development. By integrating local historical and cultural resources with modern artistic creations, Liwan's urban art districts promote deep integration between culture and economy.

4.1.1. Concept and functions of urban art districts

Urban art districts refer to cultural industry clusters within specific city spaces, gathering artists, designers, cultural workers, and other groups. These districts focus on artistic creation, display, and sales. As an important cultural brand of Liwan, cultural tourism festivals attract a large number of tourists to participate and experience. During these festivals, art districts organize various activities such as handicraft exhibitions, displaying the creative achievements of local artists and Lingnan culture-themed cultural creative products.

Through these cooperations, cultural tourism festivals not only provide a platform for cultural consumption experiences but also bring more tourists and market opportunities to art districts. The integration of art districts and cultural festival activities enriches the content of cultural tourism festivals, enhancing their cultural influence and economic benefits.

4.4. Interaction and participation of art districts and communities

The development of art districts not only relies on the creation of artists and creative workers but also involves the broad participation of communities. Active community participation can not only enhance the vitality of art districts but also strengthen residents' identification with local culture.

4.4.1. Promotion of community art projects

5. Analysis of the collaborative development model between cultural heritage and urban art districts

7. Suggestions for the collaborative development of cultural heritage and urban art districts in Liwan District

In the future, policy support should be further strengthened to ensure adequate resource allocation for the protection of cultural heritage and the development of art districts. Focusing on the theme of collaborative development between the cultural heritage of "March 3rd Beidi's Birthday" in Liwan District of Guangzhou and the city's art district, this study reveals the multi-level interaction and symbiotic relationship between cultural heritage and modern urban art districts in contemporary society through in-depth analysis of the cultural background, revitalization paths, challenges, and countermeasures of the traditional festival of Beidi's Birthday. Through literature analysis, field research, and case studies, this research proposes a theoretical framework and practical pathway for the revitalization of cultural heritage and collaborative development with art districts, providing a valuable reference for the protection and revitalization of cultural heritage in other cities.

The "March 3rd Beidi's Birthday" celebration in Liwan District not only revitalizes traditional culture through cultural creativity and modern technological means but also promotes the development of the cultural and creative industries and enhances regional cultural identity and cultural brand value through integration with the art district. Based on this, the study systematically explores the paths and methods for the collaborative development of cultural heritage and urban art districts in Liwan District, emphasizing the importance of policy support, community participation, cultural creativity, and the integration of technology.
